Our Programs and Services

Brightpoint responds to community, family, and individual needs with flexible and attainable solutions. Our diverse range of human services, support, and resources helps overcome life's challenges, builds financial stability, and creates brighter futures for all.



CHILDREN & YOUTH

EARLY CHILDHOOD

Early Childhood programs are available in Allen, DeKalb, Noble, and Whitley Counties.

Early Head Start is for pregnant women and children up to age 3. The emphasis is on a healthy pregnancy, child development, financial stability, parenting skills, and a smooth transition into preschool.

Head Start is a comprehensive preschool program for 3- to 5-year-olds that provides education, health, nutrition, and other social services for children (including those with special needs) and their families.

YOUTH EVOLVEMENT

Jobs for America's Graduates (JAG) is a resiliency-building workforce program that helps students in grades 9-12 learn in-demand employability skills and provides a bridge to post-secondary education and career advancement opportunities.

Focus Forward assists young adults ages 16-24 as they overcome educational and occupational barriers through intensive one-on-one support and development of a personalized employment plan.



INDIVIDUALS & FAMILIES

Child Care Assistance helps families afford quality child care for children younger than 13 so parents can work, go to school, or receive job training. On My Way Pre-K grants are given to low-income families with 4-year-olds so they have access to a high-quality pre-K program the year before they begin kindergarten.

Family Development is a holistic, in-home visitation program that helps families move from economic uncertainty to stability by using their strengths to set and accomplish goals.

Financial Foundations teaches about saving and budgeting, the banking system, credit, and strategies to improve financial health. Additional housing counseling and home-buyer education is available, too.



Health Coverage

Assistance provides free help from certified Indiana Navigators to understand and enroll in state and federal health insurance programs including Hoosier Healthwise, the Healthy Indiana Plan, and the Health Insurance Marketplace. Brightpoint is part of the statewide Covering Kids & Families network.

HOUSING & UTILITIES

Housing Support & Solutions assists individuals who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless with comprehensive, holistic case management, as well as financial assistance to stabilize housing. Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) specifically assists Veterans. Other programs provide rental subsidy payments with some rental assistance specifically designated for individuals who suffer from severe mental illness, substance abuse, and/or HIV.

Utility Assistance helps pay a portion of a household's utility bills in the winter months.

Weatherization offers a home energy audit, air sealing, and insulation installation for residential dwellings to save on energy consumption.

COMMUNITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Consumer Loans are available to employees whose employers have signed up for the Community Loan Center of Northeast Indiana program, offering affordable, small-dollar loans as an alternative to payday lenders.

Housing Development creates affordable options by building and maintaining single- and multi-family housing communities.



Small Business Loans help entrepreneurs and established businesses with a range of development services and access to financing through the Brightpoint Development Fund, a U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) microlender and U.S. Dept. of the Treasury Community Development Financial Institution (CDFI).

Our official service area is Adams, Allen, DeKalb, Elkhart, Grant, Huntington, Kosciusko, LaGrange, Noble, St. Joseph, Steuben, Wabash, Wells, and Whitley counties; However, not all programs and services are available in all these counties and some are available in additional counties.
